The relevant issue here is the National Court's position relative to ADR. Despite lack of legislation, Courts are very aware of backlog and encourage the use of other processes Prerequisites

There must be a dispute

Contract, or Court Rules or Legislation determines resolution process

Playing field usually not level

Party with greater bargaining power tries to use Court system for financial advantage

The Bahamas has no Court annexed mediation or arbitration processes in place. Rules of Supreme Court might allow Court some flexibility so that individual Judges can encourage parties to go to Mediation or Arbitration, but no legislation.
