**Scott J. Silverman**, retired Judge 11th Judicial Circuit, joined the JAMS panel of neutrals after nearly 22 years on the bench in Miami. He distinguished himself as a stellar judge and one of South Florida's highest rated circuit court judges.

- Numerous international maritime/admiralty arbitrations in which seafarers claimed serious personal injuries under the Jones Act and sought monetary damages for maintenance and cure
- Complicated closely held corporate dissolution which resulted in a buy-out from one corporate officer to another
- Commercial landlord-tenant dispute between a large well-known Florida law firm and its lessor over a security deposit

- Dispute between a hospital and a professional recruiter over a claimed commission
- Claim by a major for-profit hospital chain against an international insurance company regarding alleged monies owed to it by the insurance company for medical services provided to its insureds

- Broz v. Rodriguez, 891 So.2d 1205 (Fla. 4th DCA 2005) (Dispute on whether a general release signed in connection with the settlement of a negligence action barred the injured party from proceeding with a medical malpractice action)
- Haskins v. City of Fort Lauderdale, 898 So.2d 1120 (Fla. 4th DCA 2005) (Former civilian employee of a police department who brought an action against the city for invasion of privacy and negligent investigation of allegations that the employee had illegally sold diet pills to police department employees)
- Bellino v. W&W Lumber and Building Supplies, 902 So.2d 829 (Fla. 4th DCA 2005) (A lumber company sued a general contractor for damages on unpaid invoices and sought to foreclose its mechanic's lien)
- Anesthesiology Critical Care & Pain Management Consultants v. Kretzer, 802 So.2d 346 (Fla. 4th DCA 2001) (A mother brought a medical malpractice action against the anesthesia clinic on behalf of her minor child who suffered temporomandibular joint dysfunction after the administration of anesthesia during sinus surgery)
